Read with your child before bed - a great way to settle down and encourage the love of reading.


Make the most out of bedtime. Take advantage of this time to connect and talk about the day's events.

As Elizabeth Reep struggled to help her stepsons cope with their dad's deployment and subsequent war injuries, she came to realize that war leaves scars not only on the soldier sent to war but on the family left behind. For children, it is particularly difficult to comprehend the sudden and prolonged absence of a parent and the consequences of combat. Reep, a former Grand

Prairie school district counselor, wanted to do something for children like her stepsons. So, with the help of her friend, child counselor Sarah Bravo, Camp C.O.P.E. was created. Camp C.O.P.E. (courage, optimism, patience and encouragement) welcomes children of deployed and injured service members for age-appropriate therapeutic interventions. Grouped with peers who've had similar experiences, campers are taught valuable coping skills in a fun, supportive manner. — N.J.
